The most important thing from my perspective is the need to inspire young people to want to learn. This comes from having a passion for teaching and a passion for the subjects that you teach. Blending this with varied classroom activities and resources will engage students. Never be afraid to try new things, if the exercise goes wrong, amend it. Involve students in feedback about your lessons.

There are many professional subject associations out there that support both the primary and secondary curriculum. Membership (personally or as a school) is worthwhile. Be selective about the professional development you get involved in and use the outcomes selectively. See your professional learning as a continuum.


My final piece of advice is enjoy your teaching and don't rush into promotions and additional responsibilities. It's a long career, enjoy your teaching!
